Suggested Activities Week of April 27th 2020

Math

Math Choice Board

Attached is a Math activity known as a Choice Board. It says "Grade 3" however much of the content lines up with the NB Grade 4 Math curriculum. Students can do 1-2 squares per day until they've completed the sheet. The Fraction questions can be modified so that students draw a fraction to show what the fraction their working with looks like. We always talked about dividing up pizza and chocolate bars when drawing our fractions so they can draw a rectangle for a chocolate bar and a circle for a pizza. REMEMBER: Fractions mean EQUAL SHARING, that is to say, all the pieces must be the same size when they divide a shape.

STEAM (Science, Tech, Engineering, Art, Math)

In class we kept an "Explorer's Journal" (un journal d'explorateur) to make observations, record data and draw what we saw.

Journaling is a great way to help keep your drawings and other observations in one place and to be able to ask questions about what you have found. Field Scientists use journals all the time. Watch a quick video on being a Field Scientist here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=E6iB5B3Lz9I

Students can start a "Journal D'explorateur" at home. In their journal they can create tables with headings, labelled observations, measurements, pictures/drawings or whatever else they can think of to record their observations.
